## Greenville City Fire Department Rules Out Suspicious Activity

**(Greenville SC)** While an investigation into the origin and cause of the residential fire that occurred overnight on Perry Avenue is ongoing, Greenville City Fire Department officials have determined that there was no suspicious activity involved. More detailed results of the investigation will be provided upon its conclusion.

“Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season, so we want to remind the community of our safety message - Fire is Everyone's Fight – and urge Greenville residents to please join us in this effort by making sure they have working smoke alarms and taking the appropriate precautions for winter safety around the home,” said Fire Chief Steve Kovalcik.
