Greenway Construction Projects Underway



The City currently has two exciting greenway trail construction projects underway.

Willard Street - Swamp Rabbit Trail Connector

The City is constructing a bicycle and pedestrian bridge over the Reedy River and a raised crosswalk at Willard Street, the northern terminus of the City's existing Swamp Rabbit Trail. This work will be completed in advance of the trail's completion from Travelers Rest and Furman University. Visit the Greenville County Recreation District's website for more

Cleveland Park Trail Rehabilitation

Work began this week in Cleveland Park at Woodland Way. Roadwork improvements from Lakehurst Drive to Woodland Way Circle include wider sidewalks, speed cushions, additional parking and enhanced landscaping and is expected to last about 6 weeks. Renovations of the trail through out the park will address drainage issues, widen and resurface trails and includes a new bicycle and pedestrian bridge near McDaniel Avenue, among other improvements. The entire project will be completed in October.
