- Tents/structures may not be used without permission.
- Loud music/Public Address (PA) systems are prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are permitted in designated parking areas only.
- Pets are always welcome but must be on a leash.
- All park amenities are first come, first serve unless previously reserved.
- Selling or soliciting materials without a permit is prohibited.

CLEVELAND PARK

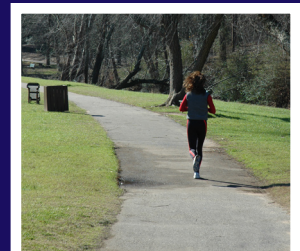


One of Greenville's wonderful assets is its system of city parks. The goal of the City Parks and Recreation Department is to ensure that Greenville's parks remain attractive and inviting for public use. The department oversees 39 city parks occupying more than 400 acres of land within the city. For many residents of Greenville, Cleveland Park is "The City Park".

This large and diverse park was created in 1928 after the Cleveland family donated to the city 126 acres of land along the Reedy River near downtown.

Centrally located in downtown Greenville, the park features tennis and volleyball courts, softball fields, playground areas, a fitness trail, and both small-group and large-group picnic shelters. In addition, Cleveland Park is the site of the Rock Quarry Garden, the Fernwood Nature Trail, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the Major Anderson Memorial, and the Greenville Zoo.

REEDY RIVER CORRIDOR TRAIL



The City Parks and Recreation Department develops and maintains the Reedy River Corridor Trail, which provides a continuous paved trail along the banks of the Reedy River. The trail affords vistas of gardens, waterfalls, historical sites and open areas.

For your hike along the trail, you may begin at any one of the following parks: Cleveland Park, Falls Park, or Linky Stone Park. The Cleveland Park Trail System has approximately 4.5 miles of paved path.

RAMONA GRAHAM FITNESS TRAIL



Located within Cleveland Park, this 16 station fitness trail is linked by a paved hiking path. This trail is often used by area fitness boot camps for training and physical workouts. See map inside for more information.

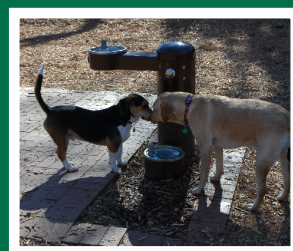
THE GREENVILLE ZOO



The Greenville Zoo is an amazing animal kingdom featuring large cats, miniature deer, giant tortoises, exotic birds, majestic elephants, howling monkeys, and so much more. Brave your way through the Reptile Building which houses (among other things) "Dirty Harry", our 8 ft. Boa Constrictor.

CANINE CORNER



The Canine Corner located at the corner of Woodland Way Circle and Woodland Way (just across from the Cleveland Park Animal Hospital and the Horse Stables) is the perfect place for canine friends to visit in the park. A fence surrounds the area offering wide open spaces for exercise and relaxation. There's also some tough security to keep your pooch from getting out, the Canine Corner has two double gated entrances, keeping dogs from running free or escaping. Once inside the gates, owners and their dogs can enjoy the scenery, and make a couple of new friends. Pet owners can let their dogs run free, and socialize at the same time.
