Public Safety Campus Renovation/Upfit

Background

- November 2021 City purchases 204 Halton Road and adjacent property for use as Municipal Court, Police and Fire Headquarters, and other uses, and appropriates \$27 million - \$18.9m for purchase and \$8.1 for renovations
- 11/21-6/22 City Staff prepares internal space need plans, drafts RFP for Design-Build Contract
- 6/22 RFP process renders six responses; four finalists interviewed. Hogan/McMillan Pazdan Smith team selected for award.
- 11/22 Design-Build team completes initial design, provides estimated cost of \$17 million plus owner costs (IT-related) of about \$3 million. Staff works through several rounds of value engineering exercises with Hogan/MPS team to bring costs down by about \$3 million to a total of \$17.1 million.



Next Steps

- City has authorized Hogan/MPS team to move ahead with demolition package and order some long-lead time items
- About \$6.5 million of original appropriation available for use after design fees and some technology purchases
- Additional resources of about \$10.7 million needed to complete the project, broken down below:
