PERMITS & TIPS

Are street performers required to have a permit?

[Are tips & gratuities allowed?]

- If a performer is accepting tips, they are required to have a street performer permit.
- If a performer does not wish to take tips, they are not required to obtain a street performer permit.

Permits must always be shown.

- A street performer must always have their permit visibly displayed during their performance.
- When performing as a group, each group member must have their own permit.
- Performers cannot set a price for their performance or service.
- Performers are not allowed to accept tips if they are not displaying a permit.



SOUND RULES

- All amplification must be battery powered.
- Sound may not prohibit normal conversation levels at 20 feet or more from where the sounds originates (measured horizontally and vertically).

1 HOUR RULE

- Street Performers are only allowed to play in one location for one hour at a time.
- Please consult complaint instructions at the top of this page if you notice that someone has been playing in a location for more than one hour.

Permitted locations on Main Street:

One City Plaza, City Hall, Falls Park, Graham Plaza, TD Bank Building, Main St. / Augusta St. Intersection, Court Street area

Prohibited locations:

NOMA Square, Courtyard Marriott, Camperdown, Wells Fargo Bank, and Port City Java areas
